Overview:

This year's conference explores different kinds of journeys we go through as psychologists. A journey of becoming better supervisors and mentors and journey of finding professional identities as a person of minority will be explored. In addition to the sessions related to the conference theme, skill building sessions, such as preparation for interviews and MEPPP, and improving supervision skills will be offered. This year's conference also added a session on meeting with Training Directors to help students prepare for internship, a session on technology and its implication on training, and self-care that is often neglected but critical component for the longevity of our journey.

Conference Location:

Arizona State University - West Campus, University Center Building, 4701 W. Thunderbird Road, Glendale, AZ 85306. The conference will begin in the LaSala Ballroom.
